Message from the President

One could actually see the edge of the final wind, trees bending as it came through the yard, to be followed by a calm swift temperature drop and then the pea size hail changing to mothball size. I was sure glad I had just put my cars back into the garage.

Which brings us to the weather for this coming weekend (or more accurately – came a few weekends ago, by the time everyone reads this) for InterMarque Kickoff in Osseo. It seems I'm always writing about these things in future tense, only to have them printed in final tense. Anyway – this weekend's event promises (or promised) to be near 80 followed by thunderstorms. This is much better than past years where snow flurries have been spotted. I sure hope we had a good showing at InterMarque.

My point to this weather tribulation is – I wound up driving my MGB more in April than May – so far, anyway; but alas this IS Minnesota.

At the recent MMGG bi-monthly officer's & others meeting, we decided to start donating funds to various MG

related activities. Of course we are only crawling forward at this time with this idea. To start we received a request to donate to the Vintage Race Car group (MMGG members) so the Board approved this the reduced amount of \$150. We also thought we would start donating to the club(s) organizing/hosting Rendezvous. This one got a bit complicated and will require a re-analysis, because it appears this event may be generating a profit for the host. More on this later. I do wish to emphasize we are “crawling” at this point – while we pull in the reins on other club expenses. We will adjust our future benevolences as budgets allow.

Our cash flow is actually much improved in 2015 compared to past years, in that the vast majority of members actually paid their dues on time this year. I've been an officer of this club for about 6 years now, and this is the first time I've seen such an improvement. In the past the ongoing average for payment was that about 50% of the members had paid by the middle of the year, with some dragging payment out many more months. Our Treasurer reported at our recent meeting that there were less than a dozen members in unpaid status by the end of April. This is a vast improvement and I THANK the members for helping to resolve this issue. It creates much less work for several of us having dues paid on time.

And speaking of much less work, reading Dave Braun's article in April on front-ends, resulted in a few flashbacks. First off though, I say the article was a fine bit of tech advice. I replaced the boots on the 72B and it was a BIG task to get one of the tie-rod ends off (torch,

pipe wrenches, 2 people) – I kept thinking I was trying to open the gates on one of the lock & dams by hand, but it came off and I got the boots replaced. The flashbacks started when it was time to do the toe adjustment. Back in the 70s I was at some military technical school in Illinois and we learned how to do frame and toe work with plumb-bob, squares, some weird wooden set of angles the size of an American car, etc. I think this was the same thing they used on chariots or stage coaches! When it came time to do my toe adjustment on the 72B, I only had a metal tape measure. Did you know that the play on the little metal tab on a tape measure is more than the range of tolerance for specs for toe-in! Eventually I wound up with string and other things to get it right. Yeah - \$20-\$30 at the closest tire shop would have been time saved, but then I'm frugal. Besides once I'm only the floor crawling around I may as well stay there until I'm done.

Somewhere in the June Gazette there will be New Member information. If the new member(s) live near you – please try and stop in to welcome them to the club.

Oh, and if you think you need odd parts for you MGs and you want to see the St. Croix River, you can always stop by my garage to see what I have in all the bins and on the shelves. Yes, I'm still trying to get rid of a lot of stuff. Added to this is now my overstocking of Honda Accord air filters, oil filters, cabin filters, etc. If I ever get organized I should take photos and post them.

RENDEZVOUS RALLYE SUPERIEUR

**Fun Run
June 6-11, 2015**



Rendezvous Rallye Superieur is a tour around Lake Superior. The rallye will embark from Ashland, Wisconsin, USA, on June 6, circumnavigate Lake Superior and arrive back in Ashland on June 11. Many (but not necessarily all) of its participants will likely be the more adventurous souls: in their vintage cars attending the 25th annual U.S./Canada International Sports Car Rendezvous that kicks off on June 11. Some of the cities through which the Rallye will pass include Duluth, Grand Marais, Thunder Bay, Wawa, Sault St. Marie, and Marquette.

Is this a pretentious, big-deal rally like the California Mille or the Monte Carlo? Well, it's a big deal for us and it will cover some exquisite roads and locations, but there the similarities end. Most importantly, there is no competition. No fast driving awards, no checkpoints, and no incentive to trash your old car. Just an extended tour on which you can enjoy your vintage car with other aficionados.

Is participation limited to older vehicles? Yes. By old we mean 25+ years old. For the arithmetically challenged that means 1990 and older. Exceptions may be granted by the rallye master for retronobiles that he believes maintain the classic spirit and vintage joie de vivre.

Is this as expensive as Hemmings' Great Race? No. You will pay for five-and-a-half days of food and lodging, and for maybe 1500 miles of gasoline. All as you go and all on your own Visa card. Once we have an idea of how many will participate, arrangements will be made so that moderate lodging and restaurants is available. The only extra cost to which you will be liable covers your prestigious Rallye Rendezvous Superieur magnetic emblem (a nice compliment to the free Circle Tour window sticker).

Friday's Sundae Drives for 2015

Well here we are again, that long cold winter is over and spring is finally here. It's time to get that MG out of storage and hit the roads with friends for some summer fun. Last year we were very lucky and had excellent weather on every drive, with my luck this year it'll probably rain every month. Hey, no one ever accused me of being an optimist. Since I'm kind of running out of ideas and nice roads, I'll have to recycle a previous drive from 2012, but this year's July and August drives are all new.

The June 19th drive is a repeat of the June 2012 drive from Applebee's on the NW corner of 14440 Weaver Lake Rd and 94. Starting with suburban roads, this drive is mostly open country, through Dayton and back down West River Rd to a Dairy Queen on the SE corner of 11200 Aquilla Dr. North and 169 in Champlin. Up the east side of 35E, and through Centerville and back to a Dairy Queen on 625 Apollo Dr. in Lino Lakes. Drive starts at 7pm and takes about 1 hour.

The August 21st drive is still up in the air. The idea I have for the drive depends on if the one section of road construction is finished in time. It's supposed to be finished in August, so I'll have to wait and see. The only notice and specific details will be via e-mail and the MMGG web site.


