
Now for a word from my Administrative side...

Friday's Sundae drives for 2016

Summer is finally here, and that means it's time for fun with friends, drives in our MG's, along with some ice cream. Each year it's a bit of a challenge to come up with 3 new interesting drives, so I'm going to repeat one drive from 2013. The July and August drives are all new with different and interesting destinations though. As in all the previous years, the dates are easy to remember, *they're all on the 3rd Friday of each summer month*. We meet at 7 pm and drive soon after that, all the drives are on paved roads with a mix of city, suburban and country roads.

There are no rain dates and if the weather looks stormy, the drive is cancelled. Information about the drives is also on the MMGG web site.

The June 17th drive is a repeat from 2013 and starts at Jimmy John's on 13300 Bass Lake Rd and 494 in Maple Grove. We drive north around Weaver Lake and down through Hamel and Loretto, and around Lake Independence. We work our way back towards the city by way of Medina Rd to a Dairy Queen on 4000 Annapolis Lane in Plymouth.

The July 15th drive starts at a Bakers Square across from the Ford plant on 2249 Ford Parkway. We drive across the bridge to West River Rd and up the Mississippi and then cross back over the river on either the Franklyn Ave bridge or the 10th St bridge, depending on road construction. We drive through part of the U and back down East River Rd. Past 7th St and then north on Edgcumbe Rd, west on Randolph to Nelson's Ice Cream store at 454 Snelling Ave. Just like Nelson's in Stillwater, they're known for their large portions.

The August 19th drive starts in the north parking lot of Target on 7841 Amana Trail in Inver Grove Heights. That's 1 block NW of So Robert Trail and Highway 55. We drive SSE through country roads and eventually east into downtown Hastings. We have to circle around the block in town to get onto Highway 61 North, up Manning Ave/95 for a short distance, and then back onto quite country roads, ending at Old Tyme Fudge and Ice Cream on 8800 E. Point Douglas Rd. in Cottage Grove. Besides ice cream, they have an assortment of flavors of fudge.





Eau Claire British Car

Eau Claire, Wisconsin, is a hop, skip and a jump from Minnesota's Twin Cities, but the one-hour ride can save a British sports car owner a lot of money. That's one of the secrets behind the success of Eau Claire British Car (britcarparts@charter.net), a shop located in the beautiful Chippewa Valley.

"We charge \$85 an hour for labor," said ECBC proprietor Steve Rindt. "We've been told that the labor rates in other parts of the Midwest can be considerably higher." Not that a restoration taking many hours isn't still expensive, but Rindt's shop does both restoration and repair work. So, even though time factors into the job, the savings on the hourly rate is a big draw to British car enthusiasts.



Rindt is a British car owner himself. His own fleet includes several MGBs, a Triumph GT6 and a E-Type Jaguar that's getting a complete nut and bolt restoration. His wife also drives a MGB, so Rindt feels a commitment to provide the best quality service and restoration for classic British cars.

"Being avid British car enthusiasts ourselves, we enjoy the company of others who have an appreciation for these fine automobiles," Rindt told *Speedville*. "We believe these cars were meant to be driven and our goal is to keep as many of them on the road as possible."

The shop specializes in MG, Triumph, Austin-Healey, Jaguar and Classic Mini. "We also provide the same quality service for most classic European sports cars," adds Rindt, who also has an Alfa Romeo Spider in his personal collection.
