Judder was off the road until 1986 when Lew found out he was to be reassigned again - this time back in the Twin Cities area. During a planning trip to Minneapolis, he got Minnesota license plates to take back to Judder in Copenhagen. With U. S.A. plates, Lew and Darlene were able to drive the car for the remainder of time they spent in Copenhagen.

There have also been "modern" MGs in the Palmer's garage. For several years in the late 1980s an MGB GT served as a daily driving car. They currently own a 1973 MGB roadster and a 1980 Limited Edition.

Even with the J.2 in need of major attention, Lew and Darlene have taken on two more MG projects. First was an MGA. This car was the parts donor to a

restoration project of another "A". The chassis and mechanicals have been restored and it is being painted right now (a dark emerald green with tan interior.)

The second additional project is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that has its roots in Lew's childhood. His parents were strong supporters of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. As a young boy, Lew was introduced to many of the musicians, one of whom was the trumpet player Jerry Goguen.

Many years later, Lew found out that Jerry was an MG enthusiast and had become a parts dealer specializing in T series cars. In the early 1970's Goguen went on a campaign to buy up the world's supply of rare and important MG cars that led to his Abingdon Spares, Ltd. business in New Hampshire and establishment of the Westminster MG Car Museum in nearby Westminster, Vermont. There, Goguen housed more than 40 historically significant MG cars including examples of rare collector cars like the J.4 and K.3. There was also an Airline Coupe, which Darlene had admired many times.

In 1999, Lew found out that Goguen was selling off his MG collection. An email went from the Palmers to the Goguens asking about the Airline Coupe and expressing interest in acquiring it. No answer came back and

their hopes started to sink.

After some time had passed, a message came from Jerry Goguen's wife Doris. They had misplaced the Palmer's message about the Airline Coupe and had just found it. Were they still interested?

Well, Lew tried to down play the idea of buying the car to Darlene. He remembered the car as being a basket case and the Goguens wanted a lot of money for it. But finally, they decided it was worth taking the next step.

Lew met the Goguens at their home, helped them get through four-foot snow banks to enter into the museum building. It was a remodeled cow barn and each car sat in its own stall.

Close inspection revealed that the Airline Coupe was in better shape than he had remembered. But it was still clearly an "original" car in need of a lot of work. But Lew had missed on two Airline Coupes before and wasn't going to let this one slip through his fingers.

Lew thought they should call the car "Bessie" because it was the contented car that came out of a cow barn. But Darlene insisted on "Elizabeth" because she's the queen of MGs.

A Middle-Aged Brit that Keeps Up with the New Kids (or, the making of a Miata Masher)

ike Pierce is an interesting character. To say that he loves British cars would be like saying Jeff Gordon is pretty good at that NASCAR racing. In fact, when it comes to British cars, Mike Pierce owns it, had it or wants it.

Right now, his passion is this Pale Primrose-colored MGB. This is no garden-variety, over-restored MGB mind you: this is Mike's interpretation of how an MGB should look and drive. It also has the distinction of being a 1970 model, the only year that U.S.-spec cars ~featured the unique split rear bumper.

Mike's done just a bit of work to his MGB. For starters, it's equipped with aluminum cross-flow head, twin Weber DCOE 45carbs, a Hi-Gear Engineering five-speed conversion and knock-off alloy wheels. This subtle little MGB will suck up and spit out a Miata before you can say "tricked ya."

It's easier to understand the capabilities of his car once you realize chat Mike Pierce isn't your every-day backyard Joe. He's the owner of Pierce Manifolds of Gilroy, Calif. For more than 20 years, the company has specialized in Weber carburetors, offering sales and rebuilding services plus parts and accessories.

Today, Pierce Manifolds is reputed to have the world's largest inventory of Weber carbs and parts; the company also makes and markets intake manifolds for virtually any car. Pierce has also developed aluminum cylinder heads for several British cars, including those powered by the BMC Aseries, B-series and Ford1600 engines. In fact, their Ford head is now legal for SCCA Formula Ford competition due to the difficulty in finding the stock parts.

Mike won't say when, but aluminum Triumph heads are next on his list. In addition to the aluminum heads, Pierce also makes cross-flow heads for the MGA and MGB.

Pierce Manifolds is also the U.S. distributor for Hi-Gear Engineering five-speed conversions for the MG TD, MGA and MGB. This super-trick conversion uses an English Ford Type 9 transmission from a European-spec Sierra; Mike says he thinks the setup is, the "best-done conversion on the market

Improving Respiration

But enough about business, Let's get back to our story. When Mike was developing the cross-flow head for the MGB, he wanted to live with one for a while and see how it would behave on a daily basis. In addition to the hundreds of hours spent running the heads on an engine dyne during durability testing, Mike wanted to see how the head would perform in the real world. Would the engine survive the occasional over revving? To this end, he started looking for an MGB to serve as his test bed

In 1997, he found the car featured here-a clean, low mileage, original example. While not a show car, it still looked pretty good and needed little or no restoration to be usable.

He baselined the car with only one modification, a long-center-branch header. The MGB 1.8-liter engine made 82 horsepower at the crankshaft on a SuperFlow engine dyno, a bit off its factory rating of 98. Considering the car's age and the tendency for factories to overrate their engines back in the day, Mike didn't feel things were too bad.

The next modification was the replacement of the twin SU carbs with a single Weber DGV downdraft, although the engine dyno showed that this was a slight step in the wrong direction.

Next, he installed one of his prototypical aluminum cross-flow heads. A stock cast-iron MGB head has both the intake and exhaust ports on the left-hand side of the engine, which can disrupt airflow through the engine. The stock MGB head also features Siamesed intake and exhaust ports: despite the fact that there are four cylinders on an MGB. the cylinder head only features two intake ports and

three exhaust ports, preventing the installation of twin Weber side-draft carbs.

The cross-flow head puts the intake ports across from the exhaust ports, improving flow characteristics and allowing the option of a pair of Weber side-draft carbs. Naturally, the lighter aluminum head takes weight off the front wheels, which should improve both handling and acceleration. A stock, bare MGB head weighs 26 pounds, while the aluminum one weighs only II pounds.

With the cross-flow head installed, Mike put the MGB back on the engine dyno. Horsepower was up to 102.5 with no other changes, while switching from the original SU carbs to the Weber DGV setup actually increased power. Apparently the improved head design made better use of the Weber DGV downdraft carb. Next. he installed a pair of Weber DCOE 40 carbs on one of his own manifolds. Power increased 15 percent to nearly 118 horsepower. The next switch, to larger DCOE 45 carbs, netted another 7 percent horsepower gain, yielding a total of 126 horsepower.

With the carburetion and intake system taken about as far as it would go, Mike started playing with camshafts, since his cross-flow head and twin Weber intake setup had clearly outgunned the stock piece. The Pierce cross-flow head is very similar in design to the one used on the European Capri RS 2000, and the engine sizes are close, so Mike had an MGB camshaft ground to specs similar to the Ford's.

PBS custom built the cam for Pierce manifolds with a 105-degree lobe spacing. .470-inch lift and 303 degrees of duration. This camshaft bumped horsepower up 22 to 148.

Upgrading the Package

At this, point, Mike was understandably excited. His dyno testing was nearly done, but his love affair with the MGB was clearly far from over. He decided that a strong bottom end and slightly wilder camshaft were needed for the car. With this street combination and some suspension tweaks to match, Mike wanted to build Miata masher.

While Mike was building up his MGB, some of his counterparts in England had put together a full-on competition engine using the Pierce cross-flow

head, cam and carb combination. netting 192 horsepower at 8900 rpm. Horsepower was still climbing as the engine neared 9000 rpm, but they were too afraid to spin the push rod MGB engine any higher.

Back in the States, Mike built a mild 10.7: 1 compression engine using AE pistons, a stock crank and lightened stock rods that were Magnafluxed, balanced and put together with the utmost care. With a Mallory dual-point distributor, the: long-center-branch header and his cross-flow head with the twin Weber DCOE 45 carbs, Mike's engine produced 162 horsepower at 8500 rpm-not bad for a street-driven, 32-year-old MGB.

Once the engine work was done and the Hi-Gear Engineering five-speed was installed, Mike turned his attention to the underside of the car. Moss Motors provided a tube-shock conversion kit with Spax shocks and 15x6 inch Panasport center-lock aluminum wheels. Dunlop SP8000 tires were chosen, while Mike fabricated a Pan hard bar for the rear axle. Considering that the MGB originally rode on lever shock absorbers and 14x5.5-inch wheels, this is a required upgrade.

There are fewer shapes as pretty as the original, chrome-bumper MGB, and this one looks especially attractive with its Pale Primrose paint and Panasport wheels. Although the cars striking appearance is the first thing we noticed, we did find ourselves wondering what it was like to drive, so we took it for a spin recently through some of California's legendary back roads.

The cold engine quickly reminded us why every automobile now comes equipped with fuel injection, as the big, old Webers weren't super happy at first, The modern, five-speed gearbox felt out of place in an MGB, but we mean that in a good way. Shifting was smooth and precise.

Although the chassis is 32 years old (and the design is even older), the car does have a somewhat modern feel to it, although the seating position and occasional creaks and rattles remind its passengers that they're in a MGB, not a new Miata.

At 3000 rpm, Mike's MGB purrs along like any other. At 6000 rpm, this MGB starts to wake up, and at 8000 rpm, it just gets up and slaps you. Shifting a street-tuned MGB at 8500 rpm is one of the stranger driving experiences we have had.

Based on our past experiences with British cars, we figured things would explode at those engine speeds.

Despite the fantastic power and looks of this classic MG, does any of this make sense? After all, it would take more than \$15,000 to duplicate this car, and that kind of money could easily put a latemodel Miata in the driveway.

"That's not the point," Mike explains. "I wanted a British car and now I have an MGB that I can drive every day that will run with the best that Europe or Japan has to offer." Plus, he adds, depreciation is going to favor the: MGB five or eight years down the road.

Once the calculator's put away, there's another way to figure it: there is something to be said for having a car that's a bit different from what your neighbor has in the garage.

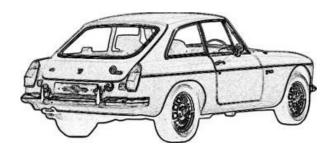
